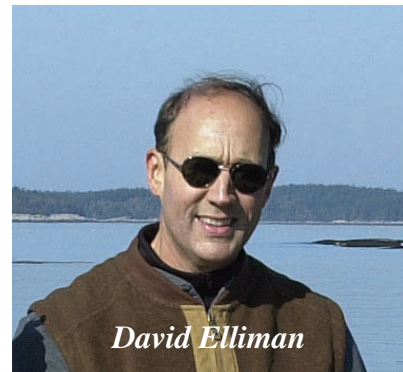

Two New Trustees Join PRWF Board

Addison, Maine: Pleasant River Wildlife Foundation welcomes two new members to the Board of Trustees. David D. Elliman of New York City and Kenneth E. Weg of Naples, Florida and Southwest Harbor, Maine were elected to the Board of Trustees..

David Elliman earned a B.A. in biology from the University of Pennsylvania and M.S. in cell biology from the University of California at Irvine, as well as an MBA in finance from the Wharton School. Mr. Elliman is a founding principal of the Elmrock Group of companies and is the Chief Investment Officer. He is responsible for the asset portfolios of these companies and their clients. The group is comprised of Elmrock Capital, Inc., Elmrock Partners and Stillrock Management, Inc., and a number of specialty- finance affiliates. Elmrock Capital, Inc. is a merchant banking company which specializes in asset securitization and structured financial transactions. It arranges equity capital for leveraged asset purchases. Elmrock Partners owns and controls a portfolio of conduit companies which acquire and securitize corporate receivables and other high quality assets. Stillrock Management, Inc. is an SEC-registered investment advisor. Stillrock manages client portfolios of publicly traded securities and specializes in equity investments. Before the formation of the Elmrock Group in 1981, Mr. Elliman served in the Investment Management Group of Citicorp as a portfolio manager and research analyst.

Mr. Elliman is an avid sailor and outdoorsman. He serves on the Board of Applied Signal Technology, Inc., The New York State Energy Research and Development Authority, and of the Jackson Laboratory in Bar Harbor, Maine.



Ken Weg earned a B.A. in English Literature from Dartmouth, an M.B.A. from Columbia and was awarded an Honorary Doctorate in 2000 from the Medical University of Southern Africa for his work in HIV/AIDS in Southern Africa. He has over 33 years of experience in the pharmaceutical industry with Merck and Bristol-Myers Squibb. Prior to his retirement, he was President, Worldwide Medicines Group, Bristol-Myers Squibb Company. He was elected to the Board of Directors in May 1995 and became Vice Chairman in May 1999. He retired in February 2001 to become Founder and Chairman of Clearview Projects which acts as a strategic advisor to the pharmaceutical, biotechnology and life science industries. Mr. Weg serves on the Board of

Directors of Fox Chase Cancer Center and the privately held cancer therapeutics company, AVEO Pharmaceuticals. He is also a founder of Metamark Genetics, Inc. a company dedicated to developing molecular diagnostic tests for cancer. Mr. Weg also previously served as the non-Executive Chairman of Millennium Pharmaceuticals.

Mr. Weg enjoys the outdoors, particularly sailing, skiing, fly fishing and bird photography.
